**General**: Sebastian Beth is listed on the 1870 TAX ROLL OF VILLAGE OF TWO RIVERS in Block 57, Lot 3 [http://www.rootsweb.com/~wimanito/taxrltr.html]

**Birth** (19 Mar 1842): Rhenish is the adjective form of Rhine - like Rhine River.. The Rhenish district of Prussia is far to the west in Germany and Berlin. The town of Kroeve (Kröv) is SW of Koblenz. (Myron Gruenwald, private communication--jbw)

Religion (bet 1842 and 1915): Dad remembers that the Beths were Catholic.

Hi Janis,

At 09:15 PM 6/26/98 -0400, Janis Wilkens wrote: >We have found the record for arrival of our BETH ancestors at Ouebec >aboard the "Alma," described as a "lubeck Bark" (master J. C. Reimers) >on 9 June 1867.

Congratulations! Not an easy one to find!

>Unfortunately the record does not clearly indicate the originating port. >Does the word "lubeck" indicate a probable origin in Lubeck? The only >other possible clue is, that the passenger list was recorded on a Port >of New York form. Could the "Alma" perhaps have been ferrying people >between New York and Quebec?

Actually, the voyage apparently originated from Antwerp Belgium, 1867-03-26. The "lubeck bark" would indicate to me, that the bark was \_from\_ Lubeck, ie the home port. The "port of New York" form puzzles me too, but I think that probably this is what the Captain had to hand. I've seen many lists from this period, which were not created on a standard manifest (ie printed form) but rather on a sheet of note-paper. This is just a possible explanation.

>It's a very short passenger list--only about 30 individuals--which makes >it appear that this was either a rather small vessel, or perhaps >passengers were not the primary cargo.

>Can anyone shed any light on this? Does anyone have further information about >the "Alma"? Thank you so much!

We only have two other ALMA's in our database, one from Swansea Wales to Quebec in the 1866/7 timeframe (no other details), and the other from Bergen Norway in 1869. The 1869 ALMA was a barque of 446 tons from the home port of Kragero, Norway. (Gery's GGMa sailed on this ship)

My mom has told me that the Beth's were Catholic and they were very religious. There are three priests and one nun in the family line. My mom thought the Beth's first belonged to St. Luke's and then to St. Mark's parish. She believes that when the time came to build a new church the Beths' or the Nilles' families donated the land on which St. Mark's was built. Their house was just around the corner from the church. When my mom visited there three years ago, the house was being torn down. McDonald's was next door and had bought the land and was going to build a parking lot there or something to that effect.

I contacted St. Mark's the other day but they didn't have any of the early records I was looking for. The receptionist at St. Mark's suggested I contact the Green Bay archdiocesan archives department for church records on the family. Sr. Ella from the archives department left me a message this morning and I emailed them back this afternoon.

I requested church records on the Beth and Hippert families. I'll let you know what I find out. . . .

The Manitowoc public library couldn't find any obituaries or any other information on Magdalena. The researcher told me that most of the newspapers she was looking through were in German and she could find Magdalena's name. The search continues.....
